Right to Read Act: SKSD's PD Plan for Structured Literacy and the Science of Reading/Dyslexia Training

## Landscape

In July of 2019 the <u>Rhode Island Right to React Act</u> was passed to support educator knowledge in the science and research of how students learn to read and instructional approaches aligned to research. To meet the requirements of this law, school districts must have all teachers trained in the Science of Reading and Structured Literacy by 2023-2024 school year.

South Kingstown School District partnered with Literacy How to provide this training to our educators in the fall of 2019 and has maintained this partnership going into the 2021/2022 school year as we plan for our third cohort of educators to engage in this professional learning series.

## **Professional Learning Plan for Educators and Administrators**

SKSD has created structures to support Professional Learning Communities where groups of educators develop shared understanding and knowledge as they work together to improve outcomes for students. The strategic decision to stay with one partner for this professional learning has allowed educators to have a common learning experience to support collaboration and implementation of instructional practices in the form of action research.
